


forget me not children's hospice





This past year has tested us in ways we could never have anticipated — as we faced rising costs and uncertainty around government funding — but it has also powerfully reminded us of who we are and why we exist.

Forget Me Not is so much more than a place where children come to die. It's where families come to live. From the moment they receive a life-shortening diagnosis for their child, we're there – helping them make the most of every moment – and make memories that last a lifetime.

This last year, we've continued to deliver truly holistic care. From short break stays and symptom control to hydrotherapy, music and sensory therapies, we help children enjoy their childhood, whatever their diagnosis. We see children who cannot speak light up at the sound of music, who cannot walk find freedom in our hydrotherapy pool, and families who come together to laugh, play, rest – and simply be.

And this support extends to the whole family – helping parents, siblings and loved ones carry the weight they bear, navigate what lies ahead, and focus on simply being there for each other.

We're incredibly proud of the difference we've made – but the reality is, we still receive only a small portion of our funding from the government. The renewed children's hospice funding for 2025/26 is welcome, but only guaranteed for the year ahead.

That's why we continue to rely on the support of our community – through monthly giving, corporate partnerships, fundraising or gifts in wills.

Our priority now is to secure the long-term future of Forget Me Not and push for a reliable national funding model for all children's hospices. Because no parent should face the loss of their child alone – and every family deserves the chance to make memories that will last forever.

At Forget Me Not, we support the whole family – not just children with life-shortening conditions but siblings, mums, dads and grandparents too.



We also delivered:

312 hours of end of life care

Being here for families at the end of their child's life is one of the most important services we can provide.

Families need not only a huge amount of support but also to feel in control of what's happening. So our specialist nursing care, memory-making activities and practical and emotional support is shaped around their circumstances, wishes and needs. Last year we supported 4 families through this devastating time.

Our bereavement support practitioners work with individuals and couples to find ways to navigate and cope with their grief.

hydrotherapy sessions

Our hydrotherapy pool enables children with complex conditions to enjoy the benefits of being in water, which can help reduce pain and improve muscle strength and joint flexibility. It's also great fun!





Meeting our promise: a family story



Single mum of four, Uzma found it almost impossible to cope when her youngest son was diagnosed with global developmental delay at the age of 2. "I was struggling so much, I don't have the words for it. I didn't know what to do or where to go."

Ahmad, now 4, seemed to be hitting all his milestones – walking, talking, singing along to his favourite songs – but then deteriorated to a stage where he now is confined to a wheelchair, dependent on oxygen and fed through a tube. In and out of hospital, Uzma was stretched to capacity as she tried to care for him and his siblings.


With Uzma's family unable to help, at one point her anxiety attacks were so bad she was hospitalised at the same time as Ahmad. "The doctors told me I risked becoming seriously ill if I didn't get help. That's when we were referred to Forget Me Not."

That was "life-changing," she says. Now, Ahmad comes to Russell House for respite and overnight stays which means Uzma is less stressed and able to enjoy time with all her children. She also gets to meet other mums, like at our spice and sparkle group where families cook delicious food for each other.

She says, "If ever I have a problem, or need advice and guidance, there's always someone here who can help. Before that I had no one. People here are like the family I needed, a family I can rely on."

With only 54 children's hospices across the UK, it's not always easy for families to find the care and support they need. That's why we're proud to have been there for Uzma, helping her to navigate the challenges of caring for a child with complex needs.



Tailored support for every family

Every family we support faces their own unique set of circumstances and challenges — which is why there's no 'one size fits all' approach at Forget Me Not. We start with what each family needs and tailor our care and support accordingly.

Each year, we invite the families we support to take part in a survey to help shape and improve the services we offer. In our 2024 family survey, 100% of respondents said they were very satisfied with the care they receive from Forget Me Not.

Here's what some of our families had to say:

"They are amazing in every way. Thank you so much — we know [our child] is well cared for at all times."

"Amazing help and support given to our daughter and us. Staff develop relationships with us and that builds up the connection and support."

But it's not just families on our charitable caseload who benefit from our care.

We're also using our skills, expertise and facilities to support children who would otherwise be in hospital — even when they don't need to be. This work not only supports more families, but also helps relieve pressure on an overstretched NHS.


In fact, last year alone we delivered 4,890 hours of funded placement care — specialist care funded through statutory channels, enabling us to reach more children and families while supporting our charitable work.

And it doesn't stop there. We also loan out our hydrotherapy pool to members of the wider community who need it — a service that offers therapeutic benefits and helps to fund the vital work we do.

Our people

Our team is made up of 160 paid staff and 495 volunteers, who generously gift us their time, commitment, passion and expertise. We simply couldn't do what we do without them.

We work not just in our hospice and 15 charity shops, but also out in the community, in hospitals and across the region.





Our income

In 2025-2026 we must raise 80% of the £6.5 million we need ourselves, through grants, legacies, our shops and with the help of our wonderful supporters. Less than 20% comes from public sector funding.

14 Platinum Partners raised over £116,000

Chaired by Ken Davy, our platinum partners consortium is for businesses looking to play a more strategic, long-term part in our future. In 2024-2025 they contributed over £116,000 - enough to fund our bereavement support services for a full year.

104 99er Business Club members raised over £40,000

Our 99er business club is no ordinary networking group. We bring like-minded organisations together to make valuable connections, share ideas and help each other. Our members have something else in common too – they're making a tangible difference to the children and families we support. In fact last year our 99er business club members contributed over £40,000 - enough to fund our sibling support service for a full year.

Reducing our carbon footprint

At Forget Me Not, we're committed to caring not just for families, but for the planet too. Over the past year, we've made real progress in reducing our carbon footprint and becoming more sustainable across all areas of our work:



All Forget Me Not sites — including our hospice and shops — are now powered by 100% renewable electricity.



We've added two electric vehicles to our fleet and installed an EV charging point at Russell House.



Our waste provider now gives us more detailed data so we can monitor and improve how much we recycle.



We've removed general waste paper bins throughout the hospice to encourage better recycling habits, supported by clearer signage on all bins.



A dedicated carbon reduction team is now in place, helping to identify and lead sustainability improvements across the organisation.
